### **History of July 16**

- ♦ 1856 : Remarriage of Hindu widows was legalised.
- 1926: National Geographic took the first natural color photographs of underwater scenes.
- ♦ 1945 : America conducted the first test of atomic bomb
- ◆ 1981 : India conducted a nuclear test.
- 2002 : A state of emergency was declared in Paraguay.
- ♦ 622: The beginning of the Muslim era and from that day Prophet Muhammad started his journey from Mecca to Medina.

## **Current Affairs Related to 16 July**

- & CEO of SBI Card. He is currently the Deputy MD in SBI. He will take over as MD & CEO of SBI Card on 12 August. He will succeed Ram Mohan Rao Amara. Chakraborty will assume his new role at a time when the Indian credit card industry is showing strong growth in terms of volumes and card spends.
- ♦ The Indian Space Research Organization plans to completely transfer the Small Satellite Launch Vehicle to the private sector soon. Prior to this, ISRO will launch two development flights of the rocket to provide on-demand services for placing satellites weighing up to 500 kg into low-Earth orbit. The space agency has decided to go for the bidding route to transfer the mini-rockets to industry.
- ♦ The Supreme Court set aside the Centre's decision to extend the tenure of Enforcement Directorate chief Sanjay Kumar Mishra for the third time. The Supreme Court declared the order illegal but allowed Sanjay Mishra to continue in office till July 31. A bench of Justices BR Gavai, Vikram Nath and Sanjay Karol said that the extension of tenure is contrary to the 2021 judgment of the Supreme Court bench.
- ♦ The International Cricket Council announced Sri Lankan spinner Wanindu Hasaranga and Australian women's team all-rounder Ashley Gardner as the recipients of the Player of the Month awards for their stellar performances in June.
- ♦ Oil and Natural Gas Corporation has created history by becoming the first Central Public Sector Enterprise in India to receive the Certificate for its Anti-Bribery Management System. The certificate was awarded by Intercert USA, an internationally recognized certification body. The Oil and Natural Gas Corporation's commitment to combating bribery was first demonstrated in 2005.

- Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana is a centrally sponsored scheme launched by the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare on 1st December 2018 for the benefit of small and marginal farmers with an aim to provide Rs 6000 per year in three installments.
- Bilateral trade in rupees was started by India and Bangladesh. It was launched in Dhaka at an event jointly organized by Bangladesh Bank and the High Commission of India. India and Bangladesh will trade in the Indian Rupee along with the normal transaction method in the US Dollar. The trade agreement will apply only to exports from Bangladesh amounting to Indian rupees, while the remaining imports from India will be settled in US dollars.
- ♦ Special squads have been formed to take strict action against pharmaceutical companies manufacturing spurious drugs. Chemicals and Fertilizers Minister Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya said that the regulatory authorities have started inspection and audit of the plants. Schedule M will be made mandatory for MSME pharma sector in a phased manner. This will help in quality assurance.
- Scientists at the Department of Materials Engineering, Indian Institute of Science, have developed a super flexible, composite semiconductor material. It is a compound semiconductor. Its potential use could be in the next generation of flexible or curved displays and foldable phones and wearable devices.
- Net direct tax collection has increased by 16 percent to Rs 4.75 lakh crore in the current financial year so far. The Income Tax Department said that in the financial year 2023-2024, so far the direct tax collection has reached 26.05 percent of the total budget estimate.
- The GST Council has exempted anti-cancer drugs, drugs for rare diseases and food products for special medical purposes from GST. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman made the announcement after chairing the GST Council meeting in New Delhi. GST rates on uncooked, unfried extruded snack pellets reduced from 18% to 5%.


